Kiosk net oop vir bestellings.

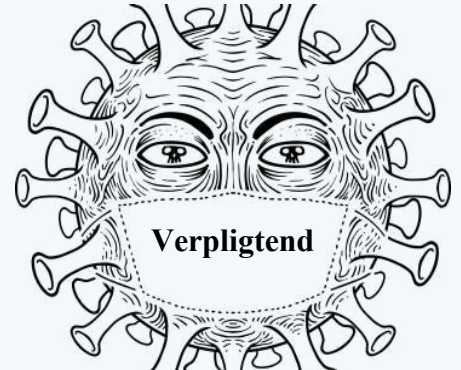
Noodsaaklike items soos kos en medisyne kan by die naaste supermark of apteek bestel of afgehaal word.

Corona Virus Rules Level 4

The new rules and regulations for South Africans under lockdown level 4 from 1 May were released by the government. Here follow excerpts as generally applicable on Bougainville inhabitants.

Masks are obligatory

Everyone has to wear cloth face masks outside their homes.

Strict curfew

People are not allowed out of their homes between 20:00 at night and 05:00 in the morning.

No movement across provincial borders

Unless you are attending a funeral (with approval) or delivering essential services.

Transport (with masks)

There is a limit of three people per private vehicle.

Can you visit your friends and family? NO.

Can they visit you: NO.

Can you attend church or public gatherings? NO.

Fast food: The sale of takeaways will be permitted between 09:00 and 19:00 for delivery only. We urge residents to continue adhering to the restrictions to ensure that the COVID-19 virus is contained. We represent the sector of society most vulnerable to infection and person-to-person transmission of the virus.

What you can buy from a retailer:

Any food product, including non-alcoholic beverages and animal food. No cooked food.

Winter clothing for adults.

Bedding. Heaters.

Toilet paper, adult nappies

Hand sanitiser, disinfectants, soap, alcohol for industrial use, household cleaning products, and personal protective equipment.

Computers, mobile telephones and other home office equipment. Newspapers.

Stationery and educational books

Personal toiletries, including haircare, body and face care products, roll-ons, deodorants, and dental care products.

Medical and hospital supplies, medicine, equipment and personal protective equipment.

Fuel, including coal, wood, paraffin and gas.

Airtime and electricity.

Hardware shops are open for the public.

Are you allowed to buy alcohol? NO.

Are you allowed to buy cigarettes? NO.

Exercise like walking:

Exercise will be permitted from 06:00 to 09:00. Walking not in groups, wearing a face mask at all times and observe social distancing.

Emergency automobile repairs for everyone.

All medical and veterinary services.

Cleaning, sanitation, pest control, sewerage, waste and refuse removal services.

Recycling of glass, paper and metal including informal recyclers.

All social work, counselling, care and relief activities permitted.

Funeral and cremation services.

Can domestic workers start working again? NO.

Can you go to a hairdresser or nail salon? NO.

Can you replace your ID and license your car: YES.

Funeral and cremation services.

Postal services and courier services for all products and services allowed under Level 4.

Financial and business services: Banks, the "payments" sector, insurers, savings and investment companies, medical schemes and outsourced administration are among the sectors that can operate.
